Spring Cleaning



Anonymous blog submission by busy mom and grandmother:

Remember when spring cleaning meant that mom was cleaning the house from top to bottom - windows were opened to let in the fresh air; clothes were hung out on the line; baseboards and walls were wiped down and blankets were taken outside? Old and broken items were discarded to make way for new items. It seemed everything got a little extra attention and was cleaned or tossed.

I always enjoyed the smell of the house when mom cleaned, but I have really leaned into the Discarding Diva role. On a regular basis rooms, clothes, books, food and medicines are gone through to look for expiration dates. Some things are easier to dispose of such as trash or a box of clothes, household goods and books for donation, but unused or expired medication takes a little more effort to discard.

Unused or expired medications need to be disposed of properly. No, they don't go down the drain or toilet unless it is specifically noted in the instructions. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has a list of flushable medications; however, it is best to dispose of them properly so as not to endanger the environment or our public health. The best option is to gather up expired and unused medication - over the counter and prescription drugs, sharps (i.e. syringes, EpiPens, needles, etc.), inhalers, vitamins, vapes (batteries removed), and more - and take them to the <a href="https://example.com/ht
